Concert One: Ensemble East

Thursday 13 June Ensemble East

We open our winter series with a programme from some of our favourite artists: Ensemble East, led by Yid-Ee Goh. Yid-Ee and Lisa Chou open the programme with Bach's mighty Sonata in E major BWV1016 for violin and piano. The programme continues with Mendelssohn's String Quartet No. 2 in A minor, Op. 13. Written when Mendelssohn was still a teenager, this is nevertheless the work of an experienced composer of chamber music.

Auckland Pouth Orchestra

Saturday 15 June 7.30-9.00pm Auckland Youth Orchestra

Popular with our audience for their youthful energy and expertise, the AYO return with a fascinating and varied programme featuring music by two composers, both born in 1865 and working in northern Europe. Carl Nielsen's Flute Concerto features soloist Alina Chen, winner of the AYO Soloist Competition. The concert concludes with the grand Second Symphony of Finnish composer Jean Sibelius. The orchestra's cello section features in the opening work Philip Glass' hypnotic and dramatic Symphony for Eight Cellos. The AYO is directed by their inspiring conductor Antun Poljanich.
